Could we all please be mindful to drive the correct way out of the carpark near the early childhood area to prevent any accidents.



### **Zones of Regulation**

This year we are continuing to implement **The Zones** of **Regulation** across the school (K-10) as a part of a whole school approach towards self-regulation.

This approach is designed to help students learn to identify their feelings and emotional reactions and learn strategies to encourage better self-regulation across different situations. A simple color-coded, four-zones format encourages learning. With optimum learning happening when students are in the Green Zone. Students also learn how to use strategies or tools to stay in a zone or move from one zone to another.

You may hear and see students using *Zone language* throughout the school and we encourage parents to speak with their child or child's teacher regarding this


