IN YOUR HEAD FORUM 2023

Selected student leaders from our year 6, 8, 9 and 10 leadership team attended the Zerozhero 'In Your Head' forum at the Perth Convention Centre on Wednesday 6 September. The 'In Your Head' forum is designed to provide young people, parents, and teachers with a greater understanding of mental health and wellbeing. It is one of the biggest annual school excursions in WA, bringing together hundreds of students and teachers from across the state.

Our students bussed it to Midland Train Station where they caught the train with early morning commuters to Perth Train Station. They represented Toodyay DHS with dignity and pride as they moved through the business sector of the city to the Perth Convention Centre. The Convention Centre was heaving with close to a thousand students from across the state.

Top keynote speakers including Ashlee Harrison, zero2hero CEO, Joel Jackson, Actor and Humanitarian, Nikayla Smith, Perth Fever and Emma O'Driscoll, AFLW, were among many inspirational speakers empowering our young leaders to become mental health heroes.

Milly Davey, Abigail Harling, Tilda Stone, Owen Warde and Cohen Pearce shared the following key takeaways that resonated with them.

* Nikayla Smith, ex Perth Fever Netball player, spoke about performing under pressure and gave out tips like 'your mind is like a garden, don't plant negative seeds. There will always be weeds. You just need to try and pull them out'.

* The Iceberg Model which is best described as a visual that not only shows success as the tip of the iceberg, but also shows the hard work and failure underneath'.

* Music and movement through Dancebeat helps people to escape the 'mental chatter' in our heads and helps connect ourselves to our bodies. The key takeaway was 'to get away from reality for a bit and come back calm and ready'.

- * Learning to accept ourselves and loving what we do.
- Be a friend to yourself

A key message that staff took away was 'discomfort is an invitation to grow' – when we are uncomfortable, it means we are learning.







Pre-Primary Cup-Cake Sale







Good Standing Processes and Procedures

Good Standing and Attendance at Non-curriculum Related Events

Students are offered the following events (including, but not limited to these alone) by invitation only: Graduation Dinner, CountryWeek, inter-school events, incentive excursions (arranged by Year Co-ordinator), Wilderness Hike, school camps. This is because they are not considered essential to the learning experience but are in addition to what the school curriculum provides.

As such, only those students with Good Standing will be invited to attend these events.

To be eligible to attend such events, students must

- ⇒ Attend school regularly (90%)
- ⇒ Have 100% of absence explained as 'reasonable cause' by their parent'.
- ⇒ Demonstrate that their school achievement is on track
- ⇒ Follow all school rules and expectations
- Consistently receive 6 ticks on daily behaviour sheets
- No suspensions
- ⇒ Receive letters of commendation or certificates
- ⇒ Not have lost good standing during the year leading to the event.

Students may negotiate their inclusion in such events. In such cases, inclusion is at the <u>Principal's</u> discretion. The <u>Principal's</u> will consider such things as:

- Recency of breaches
- Level of seriousness eg reason for loss of good standing
- Number of breaches

NOTE – Students with two of more suspensions during the year of the event may <u>experience difficulty</u> negotiating a positive outcome.

Good Standing and Attendance at Curriculum-based Excursions

Safety is the number one concern when making decisions about student participation in curriculum-based excursions or camps.

- Students need to have their good standing intact at least two weeks prior to the event
- Decisions about Cadets' inclusion in camps and excursions will be based on their behaviour as evidenced in weekly tick sheets.
- Cadets need to have attended at least 90% of instruction to be eligible to participate in a camp. This is to ensure the students have completed enough learning to ensure their safety.
- Students will require approval from <u>all of</u> their teachers based on Attitude, Behaviour and Effort.
