Harrison Stewart, a geologist with Chalice Mines shared his career journey with our Year 10 students during their Pathways class last Wednesday. Students found his story fascinating, especially because he is a 'local' person who went to Primary School at Baker's Hill. They learnt that, apart from direct entry into a career as a Geologist via University, there are other ways to enter this field of work and a myriad of other opportunities for employment and training in the sector.

Box Construction


On Wednesday 20th September, the kindy class got together with our Big Buddies from the year 3-4 class for an afternoon of box construction bonding.

What a lovely way to finish the term! Watching both groups working together, sharing ideas, talking and having fun was a treat. Well done to everyone on your fabulous creations.




Kindy & Yr 3/4 Buddy Program

Belgian Waffles

Ingredients

- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 large eggs
- 1 3/4 cups milk or dairy-free milk
- 1/2 cup oil vegetable, canola, or melted coconut oil

Instructions

- Combine Dry Ingredients: In a large bowl, sift together flour, baking powder, and salt.
- Combine wet ingredients: Add the milk and oil to the bowl with the eggs and mix. Stir in the dry ingredients.
- Cook waffles: Spoon batter into preheated and greased waffle iron and cook according to waffle maker instructions.
- 4. **Serve with** syrup or your favourite toppings

Good Standing Processes and Procedures

Good Standing and Attendance at Non-curriculum Related Events

Students are offered the following events (including, but not limited to these alone) by invitation only: Graduation Dinner, CountryWeek, inter-school events, incentive excursions (arranged by Year Co-ordinator), Wilderness Hike, school camps. This is because they are not considered essential to the learning experience but are in addition to what the school curriculum provides.

As such, only those students with Good Standing will be invited to attend these events.

To be eligible to attend such events, students must

- ⇒ Attend school regularly (90%)
- ⇒ Have 100% of absence explained as 'reasonable cause' by their parent'.
- ⇒ Demonstrate that their school achievement is on track
- ⇒ Follow all school rules and expectations
- Consistently receive 6 ticks on daily behaviour sheets
- No suspensions
- ⇒ Receive letters of commendation or certificates
- ⇒ Not have lost good standing during the year leading to the event.

Students may negotiate their inclusion in such events. In such cases, inclusion is at the <u>Principal's</u> discretion. The <u>Principal's</u> will consider such things as:

- Recency of breaches
- Level of seriousness eg reason for loss of good standing
- Number of breaches

NOTE – Students with two of more suspensions during the year of the event may <u>experience difficulty</u> negotiating a positive outcome.

Good Standing and Attendance at Curriculum-based Excursions

Safety is the number one concern when making decisions about student participation in curriculum-based excursions or camps.

- Students need to have their good standing intact at least two weeks prior to the event
- Decisions about Cadets' inclusion in camps and excursions will be based on their behaviour as evidenced in weekly tick sheets.
- Cadets need to have attended at least 90% of instruction to be eligible to participate in a camp. This is to ensure the students have completed enough learning to ensure their safety.
- Students will require approval from <u>all of</u> their teachers based on Attitude, Behaviour and Effort.
